4. MDARD Report – Heather Throne

Heather gave a brief update on MDARD programs from SCBG, Rural Development Fund Grants and Value-Added and Regional Food Systems Grants.

5. MSU Extension Report – Ben Werling

Ben provided a brief update from MSU Extension. Onion thrips are here at present. There is a new product for Valent called "Senstar". It is expensive and similar to Movento. Mary Hausbeck got a USDA grant for doing work on the Pest Management Strategic Plan for Michigan Onions. This was last accomplished many years ago and needs to be updated for many reasons, one being IR-4. The work will most likely happen in winter of 2021-22.

6. Onion Trial Report – Darryl Warncke

23 onion varieties have been planted at Bruce Klamers farm. 7 onion varieties have been planted by Mike Bosch. 8 different seed companies submitted seed for the onion variety trial. Stands are variable and thin due to the several nights of freezing temperatures when the onions were coming up and in the flag leaf.

7. MOC Chair's report - Bruce Klamer

Bruce reviewed some industry concerns that he would take to Washington DC the following week. The concerns were those such as labor, chemical labels, etc. Bruce will be joining the NOA in DC and having talks about the industry with Senator Stabenow among others.

8. Executive Director Contract - Bruce Klamer

Greg presented the board with a contract for the year July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. There were no changes for the year other than the dates.

9. Michigan Onion Committee Referendum 2022 - Greg Bird

2022 has several 232 referendum votes and already has votes for Jan and Feb. The onion committee would like to see if March is available and asked Heather to check on this. Otherwise it could be done anywhere between March and July.

Some changes to the Onion Committee program language are needed. These cover items such as consecutive terms, pronouns, and membership. See the document "Draft for 2022 Referendum MICHIGAN ONION PROMOTION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM amended 1.2020" to view the actual updates. The onion committee voted to approve these changes and move forward with them in the 2022 referendum. The main change is that there is no longer a limit on how many terms can be served.
